EXTENSION OF THE DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY**


AN AMENDMENT TO PARAGRAPH SEVEN (7)



AND NOW, This day July 3rd, 2020, I, Antoinette Johnson, Mayor of Modena Borough issued an Emergency Declaration effective as of March 19th, 2020 there were presumed positive cases of Coronavirus(COVID-19) confirmed in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania which was set forth in a Proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued by the Governor of Pennsylvania, Tom Wolf.; and in consideration with Governor Wolf's recent coronavirus mitigation guidance for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania with the Director of Chester County health Department, Director of Emergency Services, it is hereby **ORDERED** and **DECREED**, that the March 19th, 2020 order in paragraph seven (7) is amended as follows:

- The Borough office will open to the public Friday, July 3rd, 2020 with a 1-person limit. Masks must always be worn when entering the Borough
- Borough parks will now be accessible, with social distancing and masks still in effect.
- Public Meetings will resume July 6th, 2020, with social distancing and masks still in effect.
- This amendment also corrects the reference to West Goshen Township in the Resolution indicating instead that the Resolution applies to the Borough of Modena.
- Any person, other than members of Borough Council, and the Administration must pre-register for the meeting either by phone or electronically and provide their contact information. The Borough will endeavor to connect the individual at least telephonically, but will also attempt other visual or audio means as well. In that regard the contact info that needs to be provided is the person's cell phone, email or description of vehicle parked in the parking lot, if they wish to speak in person. The individual will be contacted when it is their turn to speak.

A person or business that does not adhere to this amendment to this Proclamation of this Declaration of Disaster Emergency could face enforcement actions and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to substantial fines and costs or to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days in accordance with 8 Pa.C.S. §10A06(b)(7).
